



## Working together to bring information about Washington's GET Program to families in your school or district

Would you like to have a GET Representative at your next PTA meeting, school or community event? Contact us to schedule a "GET-Together" – a FREE informational meeting that explains how Washington's Guaranteed Education Tuition Program works and how it compares to other college saving methods. We can share valuable insight on the benefits of starting a college savings plan early! A GET Representative will facilitate a short presentation then spend time addressing specific questions from the audience.

### Information sessions are offered for parents and staff:

- **GET-Together Presentation:** Invite parents to attend an evening informational meeting at your school, hosted by a GET representative. Plan an hour or so to allow for the presentation and Q&A afterward. This format has been very successful when supported by individual schools, districts or PTA organizations.
- **Lunch and Learn:** Eat lunch or a snack while learning about GET. A GET Representative will facilitate a short, informal presentation and Q&A where and when it's most convenient for you and your group. What a great way to help school staff, friends and family learn about an important topic!
- **Open House:** A GET Representative can come to your worksite and meet with employees one-on-one. This is typically arranged in a conference room or another easily accessible area, open to those needing information for 1-2 hours. This is especially helpful if there are lots of individual questions and if it's difficult to bring all of your staff together at one time.


